Song and session plan for Early Years

Introduction

We're *In a Storm at Sea* uses the classic device of repetition, which enables young learners to build confidence and security with words, meanings and linguistic structures.

This song is based on Act I Scene i of *The Tempest*. The song contains some direct quotes, in particular, 'We split, we split, we split!' Young learners will be able to infer this meaning by context, so it doesn't need explicit explanation. 'Quick quick, the rats have quit!' refers to Prospero's Act I Scene ii speech about his earlier voyage: 'The very rats / Instinctively had quit it' but it might be a mouthful!

This is set to a traditional tune that is in the public domain, of which there are several versions; one version for reference is 'We're Driving in Our Car' (available on BBC Teach); another is 'Jelly on a Plate.' A recording of this particular version is available.
